Please note the site is closed to the public! You are welcome to observe from the Port Gamble bluff.

Season 2 of construction begins in full next Monday, July 18th! The summer months of the construction season will be focused on pile pulling, demolishing old structures, intertidal excavation, capping during low tides, and capping a 61-acre area in the central bay south of the mill site.

Important note: Temporary closure of a shoreline access point in Port Gamble Heritage Park while we work in that area to remove the Former Log Transfer Facility. It will re-open to the public when work is complete near the park, expected by the first week of August. The park & trails on the west (upland) side of Highway 104 remain open as usual.

Port Gamble Bay Cleanup Season 2 activities completed or in process:

- On-site construction management & stockpiling of capping materials began in June.
- 13,733 tons of sand has been stockpiled onsite.
- 1,398 tons of type 1 armor rock has been stockpiled onsite.
- 3,071 tons of filter material has been stockpiled onsite.
- 657 tons of habitat substrate has been stockpiled onsite.
- 788 piles have been pulled since our June 16 start date.
- Water quality monitoring has begun along with the pile pulling, with no exceedances to date.

Some key planned actions during the next few weeks include:

- In-water cleanup construction work will begin July 18th.
- Demolition work begins at the Former Log Transfer Facility on July 18th and will include some late night work.
- Vessel activity will be heaviest near the Former Log Transfer Facility, the north end of the mill site, and in the central bay south of the mill site.
- Begin capping a 61-acre central bay area south of the mill site with about 32,894 cubic yards of clean material.
- Truck traffic will be very active throughout the construction season please be careful in town!
