## Port Gamble Bay Cleanup CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

## **Recent Activities:**

The three-day Pile Removal Demonstration Project began June 29. Quigg Brothers Inc. out of Aberdeen quickly mobilized equipment and was ready to start work Monday at 7:30 a.m. Piles were pulled in three different locations to assess access and level of effort required and to explore use of different equipment/techniques. The vibratory hammer suspended from a crane was the most consistently effective. A surprise was the number of pilings which were not treated with creosote, including quite a few that the contractor termed "barkies"; un-milled pilings w/ branch nubs and even some bark. A number of pilings that appeared to have concrete collars were simply pilings with concrete footings. On July 1, seven contracting firms toured the site in preparation for submitting bids on the larger cleanup project. This week, Pope Resources will meet with Ecology and others to review the Pilot project results to determine the method that will be used during cleanup.
